Overview of the department

Margaret Kehoe Ward forms part of the Medical Directorate within St James's Hospital. The ward consists of 34 beds and specialises in Genitourinary Medicine and Infectious Diseases. The ward also manages the care of patients with acute and chronic medical conditions, such as sepsis, diabetes, congestive cardiac failure and dementia.
